MAYOR J. CHRISTIAN DUMAIS ANNOUNCES THE RETURN OF THE “MAYOR’S SUMMER INTERNSHIP PROGRAM”

MARLBOROUGH, MA – Marlborough Mayor J. Christian Dumais announced Monday the return of the Mayor’s Summer Internship Program for the summer of 2026.

Building on the success of last two years, the program offers local students and college-aged persons valuable opportunities to gain hands-on experience, develop professional skills, and contribute to their community through the city’s various city departments. With a focus on fostering the next generation of leaders, the Mayor’s Summer Internship Program continues to provide a real-life educated platform for those interested in public service.

Participants work up to 25 hours per week between June – August within a city department alongside a department head or employee. The program is open to college-aged individuals who have recently graduated high school, are currently in college, in the workforce, or taking a gap year.

Interns will have the option to choose from several fields they may be interested in including Public Management, Public Housing, Engineering/Urban Planning, Public Health, Social Services, Information Technology, Conservation and Sustainability, Recreation, Building/Construction/Code Enforcement, Human Resources, Legal and Election Management/City Records.

“It continues to be inspiring to see students excited to contribute to municipal government through our internship program. The interns gain hands-on experience working alongside our dedicated staff, and at the same time, their contributions help support important projects and tasks across multiple departments. We have been very lucky these past two years to have many great candidates which resulted in outstanding interns. It is a great program that benefits both our participants and the City as a whole.”, said Mayor J. Christian Dumais.
