Work continued on the construction site during the hot summer days. The construction crews have made considerable progress on erecting the steel framing and installing the roof layers. After certain steps in the process third party inspectors have to come on site to make sure everything is done correctly so that the next step can be taken. We don't want to waste time or money in having to redo any of the steps.

We met several times over the summer with our architect's interior design professionals to discuss finishes. These include flooring, tile and color options. We are fortunate to have the input of people who do this for a living. Choosing finishes that will wear well and be aesthetically pleasing to all who come to the Library is tricky business.

Everyone is very conscious of the quickly approaching end of summer. Work will continue on the exterior walls so that the crews can move inside once the weather makes the inevitable turn to fall and winter.
