



Magical realism at sea! Girl pirates! Mermaids! As soon as I saw this book I knew I would have to read it, but it turned out to have a lot more going on under the surface than I expected from a rollicking adventure story.

Flora is a desperate orphan who takes refuge on the pirate ship Dove. In order to be safe and respected among the rough crew, Flora takes on the identity of Florian. It doesn't sound like an ideal life, but Flora just wants a bed, some food, and a way to survive.

Her plan to stay quiet and blend in goes out the window when she learns that the pirates are planning to sell their unsuspecting passengers into slavery. She joins forces with the intriguing Lady Evelyn Hasegawa (who is on her way to an unwanted arranged marriage) to hatch a daring escape plan. Just like the title promises, this story has a mermaid and a witch named Pirate Supreme. It also has a diverse, queer characters and a healthy dose of romance.

If you were a fan of *The True Confessions of Charlotte Doyle* or *Bloody Jack* when you were younger, try this darker, more grown-up take on the girl-pirate-in-disguise story.
