


CHRISTINE RECOMMENDS...

Peter Pan Retellings

For some reason, I read two retellings of *Peter Pan* last week. The first one is a graphic novel illustrated by the wonderful Worcester-based artist *Veronica Fish.* Remember when she visited MPL last summer?

In this story, 16-year-old Wendy crashes her car into a lake with her two brothers on board. When she finds out her brother Michael died from the accident, Wendy insists that he is alive. . .in Neverland with the flying boy who took him away. As you read the book, you can decide if this is Wendy's way of coping with her loss or if there really is magic at play. The beautiful illustrations contain clues about the balance between fantasy and reality.
