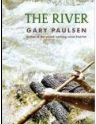
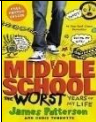
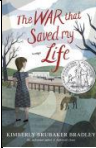
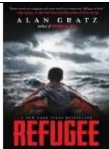
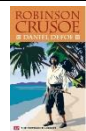
2) Escreva uma Redação Resumindo a Ideia Principal

- Faça uma folha de rosto que represente as principais ideias, personagens e temas (mensagens sobre a vida) do livro que você leu. Inclua o título do livro, o nome do autor e seu primeiro e último nome em sua folha de rosto.

Now the government wants him to do it again -- to go back into the wilderness so that astronauts and the military can learn the survival techniques that kept Brian alive.		
Any Titles by James Patterson		Middle School doesn't begin well for Rafe Khatchadorian. Between run-ins with the school bully, Miller "The Killer" and a book of rules that the school actually takes seriously, to say Rafe is disillusioned with the educational system would be understatement.
