Health or transportation problems prevent them from coming. A new Home Delivery service at the Marlborough Public Library will bring the Library to them.

Interested Seniors will fill out a Home Delivery registration form with their reading, viewing and listening preferences. Staff and volunteers will select titles

An evaluation form will tell us whether we picked the right things and provide a way to give additional feedback. 

Assisted Patrons and Staff

Their first priority was to help patrons find Summer Reading books that schools had listed as required reading. They staffed our Summer Reading Help Desk Table across from the Circulation Desk. They also assisted staff with both children and reference programming. When they had downtime on the desk, they were working on other projects in the library.

Added Genre Stickers

Thanks to their hard work, we now have genre stickers on all of the YA fiction

She will also gladly answer any questions participants have about her works, her process, or the writing life. She has some questions of her own to ask readers as well. Come join the conversation! Books will be available for purchase and signing.

This program is recommended for children in grades 3-8. Registration required and begins September 24th.

Julie will also be leading a hands -on creative writing workshop for grades 5+ from 4-5:30pm on October I. She will teach what stories need, where ideas come from, and how to get started. Julie will guide participants through a process to help them brainstorm, organize their ideas and thoughts, develop a story idea, develop characters, understand motivation,

and develop a plot. Participants will leave with their own ideas fully developed and ready to write.



Summer Reading Statistics

Thank you for a great Summer Reading Program! It was a success for all three of our departments. The Children's Department had record breaking numbers with 468 children signed up. They offered 43 programs and had 930 attendees.

Teen Services had 45 teens sign up for the summer reading program. They offered 21 programs and had 164 attendees. The most popular were our community service programs. We had 35 teens volunteer 592 hours on library projects! (See page 4 for more details.) We also had 18 teens make no-sew blankets for foster children living in Marlborough and the surrounding areas. MacDonald, the Family Resource Supervisor at DCF, sent in this response, "The blankets were such a success! Everyone loved them and they went out to our

children very quickly.... We have maybe five left, so please let your group know how much they were appreciated and how useful they were. People went on and on about how cute they were and what a good job had been done. As the nights start to turn cooler, the idea of snuggling with them is very appealing." Thanks, teens!

This is the first year we had an Adult Summer Reading program and the numbers were impressive. We had 140 individual adults participate, reading books and writing reviews. Two lucky winners took home a Kindle Touch and 12 others won a gift card to local stores and restaurants. We also had four adult programs and had 26 attendees. Stay tuned for more adult programming!
