This year our float was adorned with banners that read "Marlborough Public Library Celebrating the past... Planning for the future." Planning will be the theme at the Library for a while to come. In **October** we

will launch a **community survey**. In both October and November we will hold community meetings to discuss what we need in a new library - what services, space and collections we should have. In about two years, the State will announce a grant round that would fund 50% of a new or renovated library. There is a lot of work to do before then. We will be gathering ideas and researching options and will keep you informed on our website and this newsletter. We will need your help, ideas and input. As you visit our library or others think about what works best and what could be improved. We are grateful for your input and look forward to hearing from you!

## MPL Supports the ESL Community

Six months and counting! That's how long Marlborough Public Library has offered free English

Conversation Circles. One hour classes run every Thursday at 1pm and every Saturday at 11am in the library. No registration required! On Thursdays, Diane Rodriguez, the Reference & Outreach Librarian, takes this program out to the Council on Aging on Main St.

According to the Boston Globe article, "Long Lines for English Classes" from July 31, 2014, "only a fraction of adults looking to take English language classes [in Massachusetts] are able to do so each year with demand far outweighing supply". In Marlborough alone, 19.5% of the population do not speak any English in the home but only three locations offer ESL classes (Adult ESL at the local school, Assabet After Dark, and the Senior Center), leaving

**19.5% of Marlborough residents do not speak English at home. Three local organizations offer ESL classes, but they cannot serve the 7,500+ residents. MPL offers weekly English Conversation Circles to help with this effort.**

only a few classes to serve over 7,500 people in need (according to the 2009 city-

data.com statistics). The ESL population is growing every day, but the places that serve this group are not. The library is addressing this frustrating situation by offering a friendly place where people can practice speaking English.

Students are also encouraged to apply for library cards so that they can borrow ESL workbooks and resources, plus books, DVDs, CDs, and magazines. So far, patrons from China, Russia, Iran, Brazil, Columbia, Puerto Rico and Venezuela join the English conversations every week. "We've even started keeping track of all the countries represented in our circles on a big map," says Diane. Our talented volunteer conversation leader, Patty Helsingius, will be soon be planning a holiday party for students.

No matter what holiday or season, we have craft books that will inspire you to try new things, whether it is learning a new skill or repurposing old materials.

Books such as *Wise craft : turning thrift store finds, fabric scraps, and natural objects into stuff you love* by Blair Stocker (NEW! 745.584 Sto) and *The art of forgotten things : creating jewelry from objects with a past* by Melanie Doerman (739.27 Doe) teach you how to give new purpose to old objects that you already have lying around or are easy to pick up for little to no cost. ## Return of the Boovie Club!

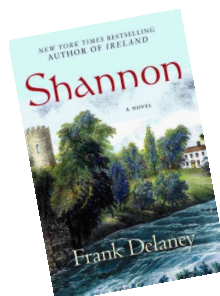
