# From the Director

## Library & School Collaborations

One of the goals in our long range plan has been to work more closely with the Marlborough Public Schools so that we can best serve the student population of Marlborough. This year as the school year ends we have made progress in accomplishing this goal.

For the past several months, school and library representatives have been working on a One Book One City program which will encourage everyone in the city to read the same book during the month of October.

Activities and discussions that center on the book will help us all come together and share ideas. The book we have chosen to be announced later this fall is one that will encourage families to read

together, which is an important aspect of strengthening reading skills and family literacy.

Another joint event held at the Library presented ways to avoid the summer slump, that time during the summer when students often lose some of the academic progress they made during the school year. "Spring into Summer" provided fun ways to maintain reading, writing and math skills through the summer months. The Library's Summer Reading Programs encourage reading and activities that help maintain and develop literacy skills, which are so crucial to success in school.

We hope Marlborough students use the Library to maintain their skills throughout the summer and all year long!

## Introducing Reading Buddies for K-2nd Graders

Exciting news for kids who are learning to read: the new Reading Buddies program will be up and running soon! Starting in July, kids from kindergarten through second grade are invited to register to be a part of Reading Buddies, in which kids are paired with high school students (all of whom have had background checks—don't worry, parents!) to practice their reading skills. Parents can sign up their children for half-hour sessions on Wednesdays or Saturdays, and start getting ready to read. Books will be provided, but bringing a favorite title is always a good way to break the ice.

Joining Reading Buddies will also help kids learn social skills, bolster their vocabulary, develop self-esteem, and (of course) develop a love of books and reading. Children who have trouble reading are less likely to enjoy it, but by pairing with local teenagers, they will be able to see reading as a pleasure instead of a chore. The best part is, studies have shown that kids who enjoy reading and have confidence in their abilities show a greater aptitude for learning and achieve more academically in their older years—even in non-literature-based subjects. In fact, there is even a Reading Buddies program at Harvard University!

Studies by the U.S. Department of Education have also shown that kids involved in Reading Buddies programs will have higher self-esteem, better attitudes toward school, and are more likely to use the library. They will also be better behaved in the classroom and have greater respect for educational materials. We at the Marlborough Public Library will make no promises that children will see such a drastic improvement, but we are confident that any time spent reading is time well spent.

Of course, the younger buddies aren't the only ones who get something out of this partnership. By being able to take the time and enjoy books, instead of focusing solely on reading for schoolwork, many teen buddies rekindle their own spark for pleasure reading, gain confidence in their leadership abilities, and take pride in watching their younger buddies grow stronger. If that wasn't enough, volunteering with children counts toward community service hours, which many schools require, and it looks good on college applications and resumes. Really, this program is as much for the teens as it is for the kids!

## ENGLISH CONVERSATION CIRCLES

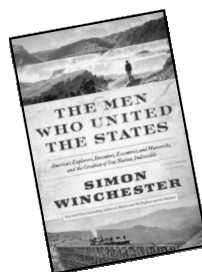
