From the Director

New Year, New Directions

I am looking forward to all that 2015 will bring. Here are four things at the top of my list:

- I. Our One City, One Book project in partnership with the Marlborough Public Schools. Our committee will choose a book that we can all read and talk about. It will be a great opportunity for us to gather together and spread the joy of reading in the New Year. Thanks to the Brigham Family Trust for providing a grant that will fund this project.
- 2. We will continue researching the possibility of an updated library facility. We will carefully look at the 1,076

responses to our recent survey and put in writing all that we would need in an updated facility. The next step will be to hire an architect to create designs of what this library might look like. That will certainly be something to look forward to! All this work

is in preparation for applying for a state grant in FY2017 that will help fund library construction projects.

- 3. Working with the Marlborough Public Library Foundation. The Foundation was started in 2002 to support the library and raise funds for special projects. With the possibility of an updated facility in the future the Foundation will be planning activities to raise funds for this project and for ongoing library programs and services.
- 4. Celebrating the Friends of the Marlborough Public Library's 45th year! Our Friends provide a wonderful array of programs, including author visits, concerts and art and photography shows. I am anxious to see what they have in store during this special year.

Survey Results Are In! Over 1,000 Responses!

Thank you to everyone who took the time to share your thoughts in our recent survey. We wanted to hear what you love about the library and what we can work on improving. We had over a thousand people respond!

Here are some of the things that we found out:

- Most of our patrons come to the library to borrow fiction.
- Most people drive to the library so the lack of parking is a big concern.
- Many people mentioned they would love study rooms, quiet areas, a café, and more meeting spaces in an updated library. We'll definitely pay attention to that in our future plans, but in the meantime we have designated our reference area as our quiet area.
- Thank you for telling us where you are on social media. 77% of our patrons are on Facebook and we are glad to meet you online at https://www.facebook.com/MarlboroughPublicLibrary. TIP: You can turn on notifications (clicking on the arrow by the "Like" button will give you this option) and you'll be notified every time we post. We're

also on Twitter for 19% of patrons who are Twitter users; our handle is marlboroughlibr.

- A few asked for an emailed list of programs. We have a newsletter that you can sign up for to be emailed to you every three months. When you are on our website, look for "sign up for newsletter" in the sidebar.
- Our top rated services were museum passes, children's programming, ease of checking out materials, and our helpful staff.
- People have requested more fiction, DVDs and music, and we're working on that.
- We have started a speed reads program for popular books. They are only available to Marlborough patrons. You can find those across from the new books.
- Lastly, there have been requests to change our summer hours, and we are glad to announce that now we will be open 9am to 5pm on Saturdays all year long!

Taking Time for Yourself


The new year often makes people think about change. It is a time to reflect on the year that has passed and look forward to the year that will come. Many people make resolutions to improve themselves in some way, but there are many different ways to focus on the idea of "self" and find ways to improve. Our collections have a lot to offer, whether you hope to learn something new, like a foreign language by using Mango Languages, or teaching yourself to play guitar by checking out the book and CD combo Play Acoustic Guitar in Minutes by Andrew DuBrock (NEW! 787.87 Dub). Books like Small Move, Big Change: Using Microresolutions to Transform Your Life Permanently by Caroline L. Arnold (NEW! 158.1 Arn) and Your Life Calling: Reimagining The Rest of Your Life by Jane Pauley (NEW! 650.1 Pau) can help you make or cope with big changes in your life, such as switching jobs. Similarly, books like 10% Happier: How I Tamed the Voice In My Head, Reduced Stress Without Losing My Edge, and Found Self-Help That Actually Works—A True Story by Dan Harris (NEW! 158.12 Har) and The Village Effect: How Face-To-Face Contact Can Make Us Healthier, Happier, and Smarter by Susan Pinker (NEW! 302 Pin) examine various ways you can improve your overall happiness. On the other hand, books like Change Your Clothes, Change Your Life: Because You Can't Go Naked by George Brescia (NEW! 646.404 Bre) and In Real Life: Love, Lies, & Identity in the Digital Age by Yaniv Schulman (NEW! 302.302 Sch) look at much more specific aspects of life, such as fashion and interpersonal relationships, and their effect on self-perception and well-being. Ask a reference librarian for help identifying more books to suit your needs in the new year!


