Motor Vehicle Excise Bills Demand Deadline Extended

The City of Marlborough will delay the date in which motor vehicle excise demand fees are applied until **Thursday, April 30, 2020**. Motor Vehicle excise bills were due on March 20, 2020, with a demand notice set to go out on March 27, 2020.

MPS Meal Continuity Plan

Marlborough Public Schools will **continue providing breakfast and lunch to all families** in our community. **Meals are available at no charge for anyone who is 18 years old or younger.** Anyone who wishes to have access to meals may do so without any application or identification process. Meals are available to all Marlborough families, regardless of school enrollment or any income eligibility status during the regular school year. This includes families from other schools in the community, such as IC and AMSA. This program began on Wednesday 3/18 and has delivered over 4,000 meals and is expected to double to support families through the weekend. This program continues to be working well and provides food security to many Marlborough residents.
