This applies to all workers and customers of businesses and other organizations opened to the public, including grocery and retail stores and public transportation. The governor's executive order does not apply to children under the age of 2 or anyone who is unable to wear a mask due to medical conditions or other Massachusetts Department of Public Health issued exemptions. State health officials will issue additional guidance on children between the ages of 2-5. Baker discouraged residents from using medical grade masks, saying those should be reserved for medical personnel, first responders and others on the front lines of the coronavirus pandemic.

Atualizações da Cidade de Marlborough sobre COVID-19 **5 de Maio de 2020**

Prazo de Pagamento de Taxas de Demanda de Imposto sobre Veículos Motorizados Estendido

A cidade de Marlborough postergará a data em que as taxas de demanda de imposto sobre veículos automotores forem aplicadas por mais 30 dias até sexta-feira, 5 de junho de 2020. As contas de imposto de veículos automotores venciam originalmente em 20 de março de 2020, com um aviso de demanda definido para sair em 27 de março de 2020. Os residentes da cidade de Marlborough podem pagar on-line suas contas de impostos imobiliários, impostos sobre propriedades pessoais ou de consumo e contas de serviços públicos no link a seguir <https://www.marlborough-ma.gov/collectors-office/pages/pay-bills-online>, ou eles podem ser enviados pelo correio para o endereço listado na sua fatura ou colocados na caixa suspensa na entrada principal ou de trás da prefeitura durante o horário comercial.

Máscaras Necessárias em Público Começam Amanhã

Na semana passada, o governador Charlie Baker assinou um pedido exigindo que os residentes de Massachusetts usassem máscaras em público. A ordem entra em vigor **Amanhã, Quarta-Feira, 6 de Maio, e exige que os residentes usem uma cobertura facial em locais públicos quando não podem se distanciar socialmente**. Isso se aplica a todos os trabalhadores e clientes de empresas e outras organizações abertas ao público, incluindo supermercados e lojas de varejo e transporte público. A ordem executiva do governador não se aplica a crianças com menos de 2 anos de idade ou a quem não puder usar uma máscara devido a condições médicas ou outras isenções emitidas pelo Departamento de Saúde Pública de Massachusetts. As autoridades estaduais de saúde emitirão orientações adicionais sobre crianças de 2 a 5 anos. Baker desencorajou os residentes a usar máscaras de grau médico, dizendo que elas deveriam ser reservadas para pessoal médico, socorristas e outras pessoas na linha de frente da pandemia de coronavírus.
