#### The Final Touches

We're almost ready to unveil the newly renovated library at 35 West Main Street!

Because we have no intention of making you wait any longer than absolutely necessary, we'd like to mention some final touches that, happily, won't delay our grand reopening. Among these are landscaping, finished elements of the hardscape, and some remaining details related to the restoration of the Carnegie Building (such as a beautiful, custom-made mahogany door that will be installed sometime this fall, and the Palladian window on the east-side of the building that had to be completely reconstructed). In addition, the much-anticipated secondary parking lot will be paved when the city re-paves Witherbee Street (which understandably withstood a fair amount of construction wear-and-tear over the past two years). When this secondary lot is finished, we will have more than TRIPLE the amount of parking as before, which will make it well worth the wait!
